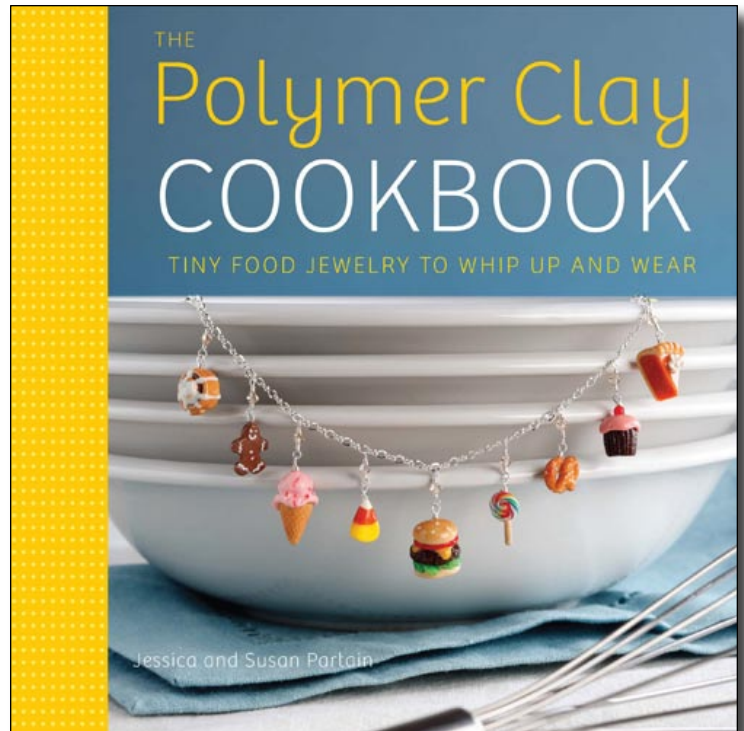
The Polymer Clay Cookbook - Tiny Food Jewelry to Whip Up and Wear
